## 5. Delegations

#### 5.1 Okanagan Nation Alliance (ONA)

Michael Zimmer, Columbia Region Fisheries Biologist, in attendance requesting Board support of the ONA's Salmon Reintroduction Work plan.

Work plan attached to agenda.

Michael Zimmer displayed a PowerPoint presentation on the Salmon reintroduction story by the Okanagan Nation Alliance (ONA). He explained that the territory extends over 69,000 km2 and that the Okanagan sockeye salmon has almost recovered. The ONA runs a commercial fishery that creates jobs. The ONA communicates with both the provincial and federal governments and continues their workplan.

Mr. Zimmer is requesting letters of support for this program when applying for funding grants.

Mr. Zimmer responded to questions and comments from the Directors.

- Explained that Kokanee are typically landlocked and that they are not typically wanderers.
- Comments regarding first nations being genetically predisposed to eat salmon and the importance of keeping this important food source strong.

## 5.2 Fraser Basin Council – Community to Community Forum

Mike Simpson, Senior Regional Manager - Fraser Basin Council - Thompson, in attendance with Invitation to a Community to Community Forum on February 14, 2018 to initiate a Thompson Watershed Flood and Debris Flow Disaster Mitigation Risk Assessment process.

A PowerPoint presentation outlined:

The Fraser Basin Council (FBC) will facilitate a Thompson watershed flood and debris flow disaster mitigation risk assessment process by bringing together multiple parties to arrive at a solution.

They will focus on risk assessment - flood and debris flow - identify hazards, impacts, identify consequences and likelihood, and assign overall risk.

The flood plain mapping is very old (25-30 years old). This plan will fill in mapping where local governments are unable.

The Community to Community Forum on February 14 2018 will bring together elected officials and staff to share progress. The FBC would like to develop a steering committee to help evaluate and guide the process.

The process will be funded by EMBC and another partner \$600,000.

#### 5.3 CP Coal Trains and Proposed Re-spray Facility East of Salmon Arm

Marijke Dake in attendance requesting support from the Board for a CP re-spray facility to be built east of Salmon Arm to mitigate coal dusting from westbound CP coal trains.

Marijke Dake displayed a PowerPoint presentation and requested a letter of support from the CSRD Board for a respray facility.

Some points of her presentation noted that:

- The coal transported in train cars is metallurgical coal not thermal coal. It is shipped to Asia.
- The risks have been shown to be harmful over long term not short term.
- A re-spray facility will help to alleviate derailment and dust.

Marijke Dake responded to questions and comments from the Directors.

Director Rysz noted that the District of Sicamous has been in conversation with CP Rail as well in regards to this issue.

The Board thanked Ms. Dake for the presentation and agreed to send a letter in support of a re-spray facility east of Salmon Arm. The Board further expressed that an invitation should be extended to CP Rail to present on this issue.
