Once the new, larger dimensions are in the Bylaw, there will be Variance requests for even larger docks. Where does it end? More importantly, will this amendment to the lakes zoning bylaw specifically mention and protect the public access to the crown foreshore below the high water mark? This is the question that should be asked in this PUBLIC survey! We need stronger bylaws and more enforcement of existing dock regulations, not more rights for waterfront owners. What about the rest majority of the taxpayers who do not have direct waterfront access? Shuswap Lake is becoming a playground for the rich, and those who cannot afford waterfront property have very little direct lake access and are expected to stay on the postage-stamp beach accesses. Straying along the foreshore subjects one to solid obstructions such as obstructive ramps and illegal docks. It is not uncommon to experience direct confrontation from entitled waterfront owners who think they own the foreshore, or at least feel the right to scare off anyone who dares trespass on "their" beach. Local government is here to protect and improve the lives of ALL taxpayers, not only the fortunate few with pockets deep enough to buy Shuswap Lake

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									I believe that the CSRD follow the provincial general permissions for docks. This would streamline the dock registration process, put the onus on the provincial government for enforcement including costs and have a province wide standard for docks that is flexible for different waterfront situations. The CSRD Directors have more important issues to spend their time on. Our local Bylaw 900 uses the old Provincial standard of allowing General Permission for a 24 square meter dock. This too small to be safe on our lake. The CSRD staff recommendation Directors that suggest a small increase in dock size to 32 square meters is still too small for many boats and locations on our lakes. A short dock can mean a long, narrow walkway that is difficult for use by elderly or physically challenged persons and a short dock is dangerous for access during storms and high waves. This will be an issue for our household both from the elderly and physically challenged persons perspective. I think that the Province's decision to allow general permission for docks if "the outermost extent of the dock must not be more than a distance of 60m (196.9 ft) from the present natural boundary" is safe and reasonable. 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										As far as I can determine, there are no regulations regarding the walkway connecting the floating dock to shore, except its maximum width and its description as being 'removable'. My personal concern, and that of the Shuswap Beachwalkers of which I am a part, is the historic refusal by some upland owners--with the tacit approval of various levels of government--to acknowledge and accommodate the public right of lateral access along the foreshore of all Shuswap waterways. Although enshrined in provincial law, this right has been largely ignored in favour of the enduring sense of entitlement of (some) waterfront owners to virtual 'ownership' of the foreshore in front of their property without regard to its inalienable place in the public domain. To this end, Bylaw 900-25 would be remiss in not including restrictions on walkway lengths with a view to requiring adequate 'boots-on-the-sand' lateral access for walkers wishing to travel the beach from road access point to road access point. Stairs and ramps as acceptable alternatives to boots on the sand is an anachronistic concept, antithetical to the ordinary human right of universal access to public property. The perfect illustration of what not to do is provided by your own Bylaw 900-19, Layden, All the planning work in the world cannot apparently overcome a retroactive, completely politically-motivated 'antithetical' approval of an illegal installation that goes against every good waterfront principle no matter how much we all espouse such grand ideas to one another in discussions such as	Yes

I believe the documents prepared by CSRD staff are misleading when they show a table indicating provincial standards allow a 128 m2 dock. The Provincial regs do not specify dock size for freshwater private moorage. Marine docks do still have this requirement and the size is 14m x 3.7m with a 1.8m wide walkway. I can't see any way that a dock on our lake could satisfy all the Provincial regs and be 128m2. The dock and ramp need to be floating, the total length of dock AND ramp need to be less than 42 m.	No
