Thankyou for sending out the proposed Amendment Bylaw No. 900-35C, with respect to property at 3700 Sunnybrae Canoe point Road, In Tappen B.C.

With respect to this amendment I would like to make the following comments. I am NOT in favour of the this project going ahead, for the following reasons.

-The foreshore land ,to the West of this property, up to the boundary of Sunnybrae Park, is land gifted to" The Wildlife Conservation of Canada," by **Example 1** a few years ago, to preserve the natural state of this area which, provides refuge, and nesting sites for many bird species, in all seasons.

Signs, were posted on the land, indicating it was a Conservation area, but high water over the years, has deteriorated the signs.

The family, was required to plant several species of shrubs and trees, on this land to meet the Wildlife Conservation, of Canada, requirements.

Personal watercraft, and nesting birds just don't work well together.

-The Lot at 3700 Sunnybrae Canoe Point ,was sold to the new owner over 2 years ago. The new owners set up RV,s and used the area ,along with Personal Watercraft, operating parallel to the shoreline, close to this Conservation Area, disturbing the bird population.

The new owners, also flew a Cessna 180,aircraft on floats, and then on wheels, at very low altitudes, across this Conservation area. Not once but many time over the summer months. This is not the way to make good neighbours, in a quiet protected area!

- The length of this structure, extending into the lake is over 200 feet. This could become a severe, navigation hazard, during high water and does not fit the overall natural beauty of the area.

In closing, the" Wildlife Conservation of Canada", must be consulted, as part of this proposal.
