Mr. Milne responded that the timber would need to be removed to access the sites with machinery and by allowing the salvage harvesting, it provides an opportunity for replanting and regeneration of the area sooner.

Director Martin commented that abandoned roads could put communities at risk and questioned how many are inactive around the province.

Director Demenok asked for an explanation between the differing consultation risk assessments. Mr. Milne advised the CSRD consultation risk assessment takes into consideration no intervention whereas the BCTS consultation risk assessment factors in mitigation efforts.
